A BILL

To require the United States Secret Service to provide protection to major Presidential and Vice Presidential candidates and their spouses at the same level of protection provided to the President, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Protect our Presidents
- 5 Act".

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1	SEC. 2. SECURITY INCREASE FOR PRESIDENTIAL AND VICE
2	PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATES.
3	Section 3056 of title 18, United States Code, is
4	amended by adding at the end the following:
5	" $(h)(1)$ In this subsection, the term 'covered indi-
6	vidual' means—
7	"(A) a President-elect
8	"(B) a Vice President-elect;
9	"(C) a major Presidential or Vice Presidential
10	candidate (as defined in subsection (a)(7)) who has
11	accepted a nomination for President or Vice Presi-
12	dent at a national nominating convention of a polit-
13	ical party; and
14	"(D) the spouse of an individual described in
15	subparagraphs (A) through (C).
16	"(2)(A) The United States Secret Service shall pro-
17	vide to covered individuals—
18	"(i) the same level of protection provided to the
19	President under subsection (a)(1); and
20	"(ii) any necessary protective measure.
21	"(B) A covered individual may decline the increased
22	protection provided under subparagraph (A).
23	"(3) In a Presidential election year, not later than
24	15 days after the date on which a major Presidential or
25	Vice Presidential candidate (as defined in subsection
26	(a)(7)) accepts a nomination for President or Vice Presi-

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dent at a national nominating convention of a political party, and every 15 days thereafter until the date of the 3 Presidential election, the United States Secret Service 4 shall provide to the majority and minority leaders of the 5 Senate, the Speaker and minority leader of the House of Representatives, the Committee on Homeland Security 6 7 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate, and the Com-8 mittee on Homeland Security of the House of Representatives a report and briefing on— 10 "(A) the threat level posed to each major Presi-11 dential and Vice Presidential candidate (as defined 12 in subsection (a)(7) who has accepted a nomination 13 for President or Vice President at a national nomi-14 nating convention of a political party; and 15 "(B) all security measures being implemented 16 for each candidate described in subparagraph (A), 17 including the cost of those measures, the number of 18 personnel permanently assigned to the protective de-19

tail of the candidate, and a list of any unmet secu-

rity needs of the candidate.".

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
